Maywood FFA had one busy summer! To kick off the summer activities, the officer team attended the COLT (Chapter Officer Leadership Training) conference in Aurora, NE on May 21-23. This conference helps chapter leaders develop their personal and leadership skills. This year, our officers attended this conference for three days. Throughout these days, each of the officers attended meetings for their specific position, as well as chapter meetings. The officer meetings helped each one of our officers gain a better understanding of what their role is on the officer team. During chapter meetings, they discussed new ideas to implement in the 2018-2019 school year. Some of the main focus points included community involvement and chapter recruitment.

After returning back home, the officers shared their new ideas to the chapter during the June chapter meeting. Multiple community service activities for members to participate in were discussed; a few of these including the Wellfleet Lake Cleanup and serving at the barbeque at the Frontier County Fair.

The Maywood FFA members were each assigned a classroom to work during the Back to School Bash. While there, members handed out "Scavenger Hunt" fact sheets to give to each student. On these fact sheets were fun facts from each elementary teacher. Each of the kids had to go around to each teacher and get to know them more during this activity.
