## Maywood FFA News

The Maywood FFA Chapter has been in full swing since the start of 2020. Members worked through the month of January to prepare for district Leadership Development Events, state FFA degrees, and proficiency applications. Our chapter had 16 members attend district LDE's in various categories. On February 5th, seven Maywood FFA seniors interviewed for their state FFA degrees. All passed at the district level and their applications will be sent to state for review. Six chapter members also submitted applications for proficiency awards in their selected areas of their SAE's. Five of the six applications advanced to state. February 12th brought the first round of spring CDE's at NCTA. 17 members participated in Vet Science, Nursery & Landscape, Farm Business Management, & Ag Communications. The FBM team and Nursery & Landscape teams both qualified for state. The Ag Communications team is submitting their media plans as well for a chance to compete at the state contest. #### How to Encourage Math Practice at Home

Math doesn't just happen at school. Your kid(s) can have fun practicing math facts and building their math skills at home with you! Math is all around us! You can find ways to brush up on math skills while commuting to the dentist, while shopping for groceries, while making and eating dinner and even while watching TV together. Below are some easy ways to encourage math at home:

-Look for shapes and patterns in the world around you. Where do you see circles, squares, triangles, etc.? -Measure ingredients for a recipe together.

-Use dice to make a game out of practicing math facts.

-Play card or board games that involve counting and patterns.

-Look for free online math games and apps.

-Count ANYTHING!

-Count change at the grocery store.

-Count commercials you watch or the number of times you hear a certain word during a program. To amp it up, spell some of the words you hear actors say during a program.

-Teach your kids the Nebraska county numbers on license plates and write them down while driving. Frontier County is "60", Lincoln County is "15" and so on. Use a tally system to keep track of the plate numbers and add up the totals at the end of your trip. Spice it up with some geography by talking about the location of the counties in our state.

-Play "ZIP" while driving! Family members exclaim "ZIP" when they see a windmill or a white cow or a red barn (you pick what to ZIP)...keep zipping/counting until you get to your destination. Make it a contest! Whoever gets the most "ZIPS" wins!

# Maywood Public Schools purchases new TIG welder

The welding program here at Maywood got a huge boost this month from the purchase of a new Miller welder, which gives us the ability to TIG weld. TIG (tungsten inert gas) welding is a relatively modern process that continues to become more wide-spread in the welding, fabrication and automotive industries. TIG welding, while slower, gives the user greater moment-to-moment control of the weld and can be used to weld a variety of materials. My welding students, Tyler Schleeman in particular, expressed interest in getting a machine that could TIG weld so they could have some exposure to the process before being asked to learn it as part of their post-secondary education. Several students and I took a proposal and bid to the board at the January meeting where Parker Johnston read a prepared statement from all of the welding students expressing their interest in buying the welder and the benefits the new machine would bring. The board approved the purchase of a Miller 215, which is a multiprocess welder that can do SMAW, MIG, and TIG welding. It can also be used to MIG weld aluminum, which is something we were not able to do before. A big thank you is due to the school board, Mr. Brown, and everyone else who helped the process along. Our students will benefit greatly from the exposure to the new process and a modern machine.
