Maywood Public Schools. I can't think of a better place to be.

It gives me great pleasure to serve as your superintendent one more year. This is one progressive, forwardthinking school district. Recently there has been a media push in promoting public education here in Nebraska with the *I Love Public Schools* campaign and I sincerely believe that Maywood Public Schools is at the heart of that message.

In preparing for the 2017-2018 school year the staff has been cleaning, fixing, and updating so that the facility is ready for that first day of school on Friday, August 18, 2017. The teaching staff, who are always in and out of their rooms throughout the entire summer, are gearing up for their best start ever.

The library will look different this year as we attempt to make the area user friendly with a more learning-center atmosphere. A door has been put into the old Ag classroom allowing access without having to pass through another classroom. Also, the replacement of playground equipment is still on the list and will possibly be completed during the first months of school.

Board of Education Policy Updates

The School Board has added or amended a number of Policies this summer. Many were required due to regulation with expending federal dollars and some involved student and staff protocols. One of importance is the addition of a Technology User Fee in the Student Fee Policy. A technology user fee of \$25 will be applied for use of school issued technology for insurance not covered by the Care Plan. If parents/guardians decline the Technology User Fee Agreement then the school issued technology device will not be allowed outside of the school building. Students who qualify for free or reduced-price lunches under the United States Department of Agriculture child nutrition programs shall be provided a fee waiver.

Another policy that may have potential impact to families is the required additions to 3012 School Meal Program and Meal Charge. The United States Department of agriculture child nutrition program now requires school districts that participate in the Free and Reduced-Price Lunch Program to have a policy on meal charges and unpaid meals. These regulations apply to all students who receive meals at the free, reduced, or full rate price. The district's policy on charged meals is: If a student has no funds available to pay for a meal, the student will be provided and charged for a limited "courtesy meal" option, such as a plain sandwich. The Board feels strongly that no child will go hungry at our school, but the reality is that unpaid lunch bills are a growing problem in our school district.


Chain of Command

Lunch Program

We encourage everyone to participate in the lunch program as increased participation results in increased state and federal money available to our school. All lunch accounts need to be paid in advance. Every month you will receive a statement of your account—please pay promptly. For your convenience Maywood Public Schools accepts Visa, MasterCard & Discover. Lunch prices are as follows: Preschool—\$2.40, K—5th grade \$2.65, 6th— 12th \$2.90, Adults \$3.75 & reduced lunches are \$.40. Extra milk for lunch or milk break will be \$.40. Second helpings of the main dish and dessert are \$.75 each. Your child's lunch account will be charged for any seconds taken, this includes those receiving free and reduced lunches. Fruits and vegetables are free. If you do not want your child to receive seconds, please call the school at 308-362-4223.

KIDS Connection

Nebraska Kids connection program is a Medicaid expansion and provides health care coverage to uninsured children age 18 and younger living in families with income below poverty levels. The program is designed to provide routine, preventive health care, basic hospitalization and specialty care as needed. The Maywood School District has a new online way for parents to apply for free and reduced price meals. It's faster, easier, secure, and private.

It's called **EZMealApp**. This website allows parents to apply for meal benefits online and it's confidential. No one sees you or your child with a paper form. The private data is securely transmitted to the district child nutrition department allowing quick application review.

You don't have to register and there is no username or password to remember and your online application is only viewable by authorized users.



Dear Maywood Public School Parents and Guardians,

What better way to kick off the school year than with a Solar Eclipse Field Trip! On August 21, the first full day of school, Maywood Public Schools will be taking all students in 4th through 12th grade, who have a signed permission slip, to the Stapleton, NE area to view the Great American Solar Eclipse.

On August 21, 2017, America will be treated to the first total eclipse exclusive to the U.S. since before the nation's founding in 1776. From Oregon to South Carolina, the eclipse will trace a 67-mile-wide path of totality across the country and millions of Americans will witness a once-in-a-lifetime event as the moon passes between the Earth and the Sun and day turns to night for up to almost 3 minutes!

Stapleton, NE is in the middle of the path of totality and land-owner/Maywood parent, Stephen Benell, has offered his ground as a viewing area for our students. Mr. Benell is not asking for a fee, just a free will donation. Mr. Benell will provide small square bales for students to sit upon and Maywood Public School has purchased "Eclipse Shades" for each student.

To ensure safety, students will wear solar shades to watch the moon's shadow cover the sun and when the sun is completely covered (at 12:53 p.m. Central Standard Time), students will be able to remove their glasses and view the eclipse totality and see the sun's corona for 2 minutes and 33 seconds.


Students will be provided a sack lunch and bottled water during the trip. Students are encouraged to bring a blanket or towel to sit on for a softer surface during viewing. Students are also encouraged to bring sun screen, sun glasses and any other items they might require for a field day.

A permission slip is accompanying this letter and we ask that each student in 4th-12th grade fill one out and return it to school before or on the first day of school. Students will be required to have a signed permission slip to attend this field trip. Students in K-3rd grade will attend school as normal and watch with their classroom teachers. If students in 4-12th grade do not return a permission slip to the school by Aug. 21, they will stay at school during the field trip as a permission slip is required to make the trip to Stapleton.

We are excited for this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to view a solar eclipse from the path of totality. We encourage you to fill out the enclosed permission slip and return it to the school at your earliest convenience. This opportunity will be an excellent kick-off for a year full of exciting and enriching lessons in all curricular areas!

MPS Solar Eclipse Viewing Permission Form

On August 21, 2017, (our first Monday of the 2017-2018 school year), there will be a solar eclipse. It has been named "The Great American Solar Eclipse," because it is the first time since 1918 a solar eclipse will be visible on a path across the entire continental United States. MPS has purchased eclipse-safe viewing glasses for all students and staff.

Safety is always a top priority for MPS. We will take all precautionary measures with both students and staff to make this experience both safe and enjoyable. Students will not be permitted to look at the uneclipsed or partially eclipsed sun through unfiltered cameras, telescopes, binoculars or other optical devices, with or without glasses. (For more information regarding the safety certification of the special viewing glasses, please visit www.eclipseglasses.com/pages/safety) Because of these safety concerns, a parent signature on this sheet is required by August 21 in order for students to participate using the eclipse glasses. Students whose parents either do not complete this form or choose to opt out their child will view televised coverage and complete an alternative activity from inside the school building during the eclipse. Parents can fill out a form including all MPS students in their household (grades 4-12). Grades PK-3 will view the eclipse in the library.
