Earlier this month AQuESTT ratings were released to the public. AQuESTT is an acronym that stands for Accountability for a Quality Education System, Today and Tomorrow. This system is in place so the state of Nebraska can be in compliance with the federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

The AQuESTT system is based upon six tenets:

Positive Partnerships, Relationships, and Success – Working together for better results

Transitions – Ensuring successful next steps

Educational Opportunities and Access – Preparing for tomorrow

College, Career, and Civic Ready – Equipping students to excel

Assessment – Measuring growth and improvement

Educator Effectiveness – Establishing a culture of success

The state uses different aspects of each of the six tenets to create a rating for each in the state. The school can be rated: Excellent, Great, Good, or Needs Improvement. This year Maywood Public Schools earned a Great rating.

They look to bounce back next week as postseason play resumes as they look to qualify for the state tournament.

The MHC football team is currently 5-2 and heading into their final regular-season game versus Red Cloud. No matter what the outcome is with that game, the Wolves will be making their first-ever appearance in the state football playoffs for the MHC Coop. 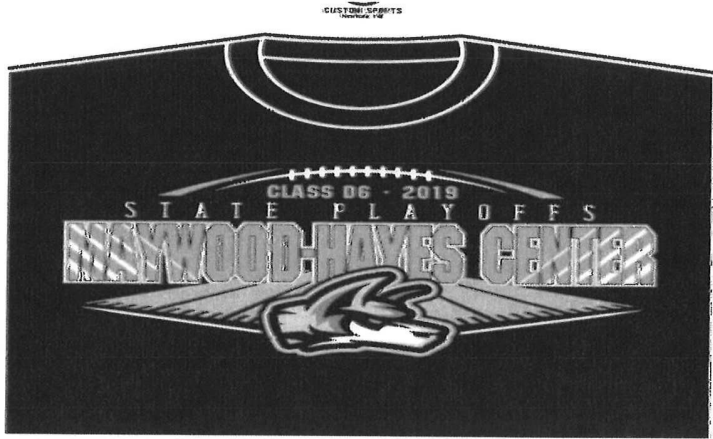
