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April Anxiety 2021

April is a time of staff, student and school experience varying levels of anxiety as we move into the Nebraska State Accountability (AQuESTT) testing for English Language Arts, Mathematics and Science. Students in grades 3-8 and grade 11 are entering their own "April Anxiety" with Nebraska State Juniors will be assessed using The ACT college exams. Accountability exams, better known as AQuESTT start this month. AQuESTT exams will focus on reading, math and science beginning in April and running until the end of the month.

NeSA tests are high stakes for our schools, the district and community. As you know, these exams rate our student's learning progress in reading, math, and science against Nebraska standards. Our goal is to have every student score "proficient" or higher on all the tests. The students and teachers have been working hard learning grade level curriculum all year and now the time has come for us to see what they have learned. According to student MAP data our students reflected little to no "learning gaps" from last year. The challenge for Maywood is that we are small in numbers and a poor score will greatly influence the overall class scores.

As parents, I am asking for your help and cooperation during testing times by helping your son/daughter prepare at home. Examining the testing schedules we have students testing almost daily throughout April in both the elementary and high school. First, and foremost, please help us get top performance by making sure every student has at least eight hours of sleep the night before tests. Secondly, make sure you require your children to eat a nutritious breakfast each morning. Thirdly, and most importantly take a few moments to positively encourage your children to do their best work on the exams. You play an important role as parents encouraging your students to strive to do their best by demonstrating their learning at all grade levels.

Why are these exams so important? The NeSA exams are a "snapshot" reflection of their learning as compared to set proficiency levels. Student grade level performance is reported in the AQuESTT State of the Schools report each fall. Although the data is designed to rank the schools as "Excellent, Great, Good or Needs Improvement, schools and districts will be compared to one another. I want Maywood students to take pride in their learning accomplishments and reflect the level of learning that is occurring throughout our school. I am asking parents to discuss the importance of their student doing their best because it reflects the learning at Maywood Community School.

Testing dates for students:

- Grade 11: ACT exams, April 6, from 8:00 2:00 pm
- Elementary Testing: April 20 22 and April 27 29.

Title 1 Tidbit


