### Summer Environmental Improvements

Two weeks into school, students and staff have recognized the newer heating and air conditioning systems in both the high school and elementary. These much needed school environmental improvements will improve student learning through a higher quality classroom learning environment. Other summer improvements include the replacement of all lighting to LED lights in the gym, classrooms, lunchroom, administrative offices and lunchroom. The newer more efficient lights will save the district on energy costs as well as providing greater lighting throughout the campus. The replacement of classroom windows in the elementary and high school provide the buildings a new look as well as greater energy efficiency. I am pleased with the amount of increased light and viewing capacity provided by the new windows.

Heating and air conditioning, better known by the letters HVAC significantly improves the learning and working environment for all students and staff. The high school is retrofitted with ceiling mounted units that provide both heat and air conditioning. This allows controlled heating and air conditioning across the entire learning space in each classroom. These new high efficiency units are digitally controlled allowing changes in temperatures during various periods of the day. Energy savings will occur by establishing a standard day and night set back temperatures when the classrooms are not occupied. Each individual unit provides wireless information on each unit's settings and performance.

We are in the process at the high school of managing temperature settings and establishing cooling levels. The elementary is undergoing a similar HVAC process establishing daily temperatures and night setback levels. The classrooms are evenly air conditioned. The back windows in each classroom are bricked in providing increased wall space and greater security. The new windows provide ample lighting and thermal efficiency. Each classroom has their own furnace unit providing high efficiency heat and cooling. Teachers have noticed the quieter operating levels of the new units and the consistent cooling of the classrooms.

I am extremely pleased with the improved air quality found in each classroom. The elementary building built in 1963 had the poorest air quality of the buildings. Fresh air will not only help create a positive learning environment for students, but also greatly improve the air quality in all classrooms. Fresh air being brought into each classroom through the HVAC units. Fresh air is crucial in reducing disease transmission within the classroom. Hopefully we will experience lower sickness levels resulting increased learning time.

Students and staff have commented regarding the positive change in the lunchroom area. "It is really nice to sit down and enjoy lunch in a cooler environment." Another individual said to me, "you notice how everyone is quick to shut the doors at the entrance of the lunchroom?" Clearly everyone is enjoying the new environment created in the lunchroom.

The upgrades and modifications are a result of the Maywood Board of Education electing to utilize an energy saving contract to replace the heating and air conditioning systems in both buildings. The Board partnered with Ameresco to design and recommend an energy conservation plan addressing the needs of our district. The total cost of the project was \$1.9 million dollars and is scheduled to provide a \$17,000 saving each year. The Nebraska Energy Commission provided a low one percent interest loan to finance the project over a ten year period. Although we have not fully commissioned the final project, I would anticipate saving greater than the \$17,000 amount. Over a ten year period the district will save over \$170,000 energy savings. The savings will last the district greater than ten years as well as provide a much needed improvement to the school's learning environment. If you have not been in the building, I look forward to having you "come and see" our improved school.
