As the students re-entered the building this August for another school year, the buzz of voices and school bells is always a welcome sound. Maywood Public Schools is ready to kick off another school year. I want to thank the maintenance staff for getting the school looking great again this summer and ready to go.

The staff has been busy getting ready before school started with in-service time. The school purchased a new ELA and Math curriculum over the summer, and training was done for those teachers to implement that into their classes properly. Edgenuity, an online program to help build skills, is also being implemented. This program helps students focus on the skills that they need improvement in Math, Reading, and Language Arts. These skills will be determined by their MAP test scores that are taken three times a year at school. Lastly, to continue with Marzano instructional strategies to be used in the classroom, Dr. Mike Ruyle was brought into ESU 15 to speak to the MPS staff and Wauneta-Palisade staff. This was made feasible by the Marzano Grant that was awarded to each school. Dr. Ruyle talked to both staffs about techniques such as proficiency scales, changing the mindset of how you have always taught, and looking for ways to keep stress out of teaching.

It has been great to have the students and staff back in the building on a regular bases. The start of the year always brings a vibe of excitement into the building. Here are a few reminders:

Requests to be dropped off at a point, not on the regular route will not be accommodated, unless extenuating circumstances arise and the request is approved by the transportation director or administration. The parents/guardians will be notified by the transportation director at the beginning of the year before school starts where the place of pickup and drop-off will be for the student(s) to determine the normal daily route. If parents/guardians have two residences, they will be allowed to put down both residences as pickup and drop-off locations. Notification of the change will need to be given to the transportation director and office staff personnel. This transportation notice must be done via email by 1:00 p.m. each day to maywood.transportation@maywoodtigers.org. This is for the prior afternoon route or preceding morning route so that the drivers can be notified. The emails will be going to the transportation coordinator and all office staff personnel, so that appropriate messages can be delivered to bus drivers. If the requested change will alter bus routes, the district may refuse the request.
