Maywood School District Multicultural Education Plan

Revised: June 2022 Reapproved: November 2025



Multicultural Education Philosophy and Mission

The Maywood School District recognizes the importance of providing experiences in human relations for those who will live and work in communities with relatively small multicultural populations like Maywood, Stockville, and Wellfleet. The district should provide multicultural experiences to our students. Our multicultural education will promote student awareness and sensitivity. It will be infused into the curriculum in all areas and grades. The students will gain knowledge and respect towards all races and cultures through opportunities to participate in a curriculum designed to help students gain an understanding of cultural diversity. The Board of Education will receive an annual report on the progress of the Multicultural Program.

Goals of the Multicultural Education Plan

Teacher Goals:

- 1. Develop an awareness and respect for the contributions of all cultures to our society.
- 2. Prepare students to develop an acceptance of people of all cultures as equal.
- 3. Help students understand the cultural forces that create differences and similarities in people.
- 4. Help students understand the factors that promote or inhibit relations between groups and individuals.
- 5. Prepare students to understand and deal with the diversity of cultures in the world.
- 6. Have knowledge of and respect for all students in their classrooms.
- 7. Develop an understanding of culturally diverse students and parents.
- 8. Possess the knowledge to help students become effective adults in a diverse world.
- 9. Realize and utilize the diversity that exists in our communities.
- 10. Develop competency for interpreting the diverse needs that exist within our communities.

Student Goals:

- 1. Ability to recognize the value of diversity and acceptance of diversity within our society.
- 2. Develop skills in eliminating discrimination and prejudice.
- 3. Develop an awareness of the differences that exist among cultures and develop an appreciation of contributions various cultures have made to society.

Community Goals:

- 1. To work cooperatively in seeking solutions to problems with multicultural issues in our communities.
- Work toward common goals in fulfilling the ideals of this plan.

Approval of the Plan

The Multicultural Education Plan was revised in May of 2022 and re-approved by the Board of Education in November 2025.

Curriculum Infusion

The Maywood School District has identified activities in the current curriculum pertaining to multicultural education. The staff has identified different activities that are infused into the curriculum in various departments. Curriculum materials being considered must show contributions of various cultures in the world.

Various multicultural staff representatives will be included in the development/implementation of this multicultural education plan.

Title 1 Tidbit

December 2025

With the winter holiday season quickly approaching, it's a great time to plan the addition of some math and language practice into your holiday break! When children memorize math facts and practice vocabulary, it frees up brainpower so your child can focus on solving multistep problems and word problems efficiently. To strengthen your son or daughter's math and reading fluency in fun ways, try the following:

- 1. Play dice and board games: Use two to six dice to play counting/addition/multiplication games. At first, your son or daughter might need to count every dot on each die. With practice, your child will immediately recognize the number of dots on the die. Many board games use dice to move figures around the board and if you don't have a board game, take turns rolling the dice to see who can roll the highest score after 10 rounds. Use the internet to search dice games for kids and you'll find tons of options!
- 2. Build math skills and vocabulary with blocks: To practice subtraction and addition as well as multiplication and division, use blocks to count to ten and for older children, us blocks to practice counting by 10's, 5's, or any other number. Help your child learn from block/number combinations as he or she builds structures. While you play, introduce new words for familiar ideas. For instance, "Let's use big blocks at the bottom so the tower will be STURDY and won't fall down."
- 3. Post a new word: Over your holiday break, decide as a family to post and use one new word each day. Challenge family members to try to use these words in conversations with each other. Great age appropriate vocabulary words can be perused at vocabulary.com. Explore words together and build vocabulary at the same time!

Maywood Driver's Education Class

Maywood Public School is proud to provide a Driver's Education Class free of charge for any student who is interested in taking the course. The class consists of 20 in-class hours covering 19 chapters of the AAA "How to Drive" text and a written exam as well as 5 hours of individual drive time with the driving instructor and a driving exam. Students must possess a state-issued School Learners Permit (SLP) by the time the driving portion of the class begins (approximately March of 2026). The benefit of taking the class is receiving a waiver for the written test and driving portion of the driver's test for a school permit and the driving requirement for the POP (Provisional Operators Permit). An additional benefit is some insurance companies offer a discount on student driver insurance policies if a student has passed a Driver's Education class.

Students can get a School Learners Permit (SLP) at any Department of Motor Vehicles Driver's License Examiner Office. Students must be 14 years of age, pass a vision test, pass a written test, provide proof of US citizenship or lawful status (a birth certificate), provide a valid social security number, and provide two forms which prove a principle address in Nebraska. Practice tests for the SLP can be found at https://www.nebraska.gov/dmv/practice/.

If you are planning to go to the Frontier County Courthouse in Stockville to get the SLP, the Driver Examiner dates are below. The phone number for office hours is: 308-367-8641

Maywood's Driver's Education Class will start in January of 2026. Most classes will take place immediately after the school day (a schedule is currently being constructed). 
