Holiday and winter breaks are just weeks away. Below are a few tips to keep children's minds sharp and challenged during their break, and it might just prevent cabin fever!

- Spend a little technology-free time together each day; work on a puzzle, play a board game, make some cookies, learn a new card game, or go get some fresh air together!
- Give your child an opportunity to appreciate arts and culture by attending free/low cost events like concerts, or plays during the holidays. Go visit a museum or a local landmark! *If COVID restrictions are keeping you home, visit some cool websites and do virtual tours that give insight to the arts.
- Encourage your child read to you every day from one of their favorite books. Books make great gifts! If your child receives any books over the holiday break, encourage them to read to you and/or read with them. Elementary students can take Accelerated Reader tests from home and/or on any phone. Go to the Maywood Public School homepage and click on the blue "R" so they can earn points for reading.
- Let your child see you reading. Read a book to them every night before bed.
- Use the break from school to strengthen your child's vocabulary. This is a perfect time to start a treasure chest of words. Have your child look up new words, then write the word and definition on 3×5 cards. Use the word in a sentence or have them write a story based on the word. This exercise will reinforce reading comprehension and writing skills.
