New Students

If you have a child who will be attending Maywood Public Schools for the first time, or returning to Maywood after attending another school, please call the office to make an appointment to register between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. The schools number is 308-362-4223.

Breakfast and Lunch Program

We encourage everyone to participate in the breakfast and lunch program as increased participation results in increased state and federal money available to our school. All accounts need to be paid in advance. Every month you will receive a statement of your account. We ask that you please pay promptly. For your convenience, Maywood Public Schools accepts Visa, Master Card, and Discover. Breakfast is served daily from 7:30 a.m. to 7:50 a.m. Breakfast prices are \$2.00 for students. There are no seconds for breakfast. Lunch prices are as follows: Preschool \$2.90, Lunch for K-5 is \$3.15, and Lunch for 6-12 is \$3.40. Extra milk for lunch or milk break will be \$.50. Second helpings of the main dish and dessert are \$1.00 each. Your child's lunch account will be charged for any seconds taken, this includes those receiving free or reduced lunches. Fruits, vegetables, and salad bar are free. If you do not want your child to receive seconds, please call the school at 308-362-4223.

School and Sports Physicals

Please remember that incoming Kindergarteners and incoming 7th graders need school physicals completed before the first day of school. Also, any students grades 7th through 12th that are participating in sports also need a physical if they did not receive a physical at school this past May. Sports physicals need to be completed before the first day of fall 2023 sports practices. If you have any questions, please contact the school at 308-362-4223.

<u>Immunizations</u>

Please make sure your child is up to date on all required immunizations. The Southwest Nebraska Public Health Department Satellite Clinic will be in Curtis at Medicine Valley School at 303 Crook Avenue on Monday, August 14th from 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. They offer the immunizations for children going into Kindergarten and 7th grade that are required by the State of Nebraska. KIDS Connection

Nebraska Kids connection program is a Medicaid expansion and provides health care coverage to uninsured children ages 19 and younger living in families with income within the amounts shown on the income chart. The program is designed to provide routine, preventive health care, basic hospitalization and specialty care as needed. The Maywood School District has an online way for parents to apply for free and reduced price meals. It's fast, easy, secure, and private.

It's called **EZMealApp**. This website allows parents to apply for meal benefits online and it's confidential. No one sees you or your child with a paper form. The private data is securely transmitted to the district child nutrition department allowing quick application review.

You don't have to register and there is no username or password to remember and your online application is only viewable by authorized users.



To access the EZMealApp, simply go to EZMealApp.com or go to the Maywood Schools website at www.maywoodtigers.org

Click on the Quick Links tab on the Maywood School home page. Scroll down to EZMealApp and click on this option. If you have any problems please call the school office at 308-362-4223. If you need a paper application, stop by the school office to pick an application up or we can mail one to you. We encourage all families to apply. Every application processed benefits the school.
