Dear Students and Parents,

Where did the summer of 2021 go? School will begin in a little more than two weeks! I hope all of you have enjoyed going to the lake fishing or skiing; taking a vacation, playing ball or swimming at the pool or lake.

We were all fortunate that Covid-19 did not shut down school and I am thankful for all the cooperation from parents, staff and students that kept our district open and moving forward for the entire year. Covid-19 Delta variant is spreading throughout Southwest Nebraska. Mrs. Myra Stoney (Director of the SW Nebraska Health Department) and I are working together again this year with our school reopening plan, which is the same plan used last year. Safety of students, staff and patrons is paramount in this process. We are continuing to get advice from the Southwest Nebraska Health Department, Nebraska Department of Education (NDE), as well as the Nebraska High School Activities Association. We will be starting the school year at the "green level" which is school as normal, no masking, temperature monitoring or special personal sanitation hygiene will be required at this time.

Extremely successful last year, paying huge dividends was cooperating and communicating as a family and school team kept our school open. Everyone has a role in making school happen. The current delta variant is more contagious and is attacking folks that have not been vaccinated. Currently 37% of SW Nebraskans have been vaccinated, making our area highly susceptible to contracting Covid-19. I am concerned that the low level of vaccinations and the implications for our school district. Currently in our area three outbreaks have been reported. If you have had Covid-19 last year and elected to not vaccinate you are susceptible to contracting the virus again. Vaccinations have proven to produce mild covid symptoms in those who have been vaccinated with no hospitalizations. We will change safety precautions protocols should our school have an outbreak of Covid-19 among the staff and students.

We are planning on a parent-student meeting on Monday, August 16, 2021 at 7:00 pm in the lunchroom. The agenda includes Covid-19, ESSERS III Grant which requires parent input into or plan as well as a title 1 meeting. I would appreciate your participation in our school plans and the utilization of \$235,000 federal grant for school learning and safety.

Returning to school you will immediately notice the summer renovations to both the elementary and high school with our energy savings plan. You will notice the new windows and LED lighting in both buildings. You will also notice that the window air conditioners are gone and both buildings have new heating and air conditioning in the learning areas. We have new boilers in the high school and a new hot water heater. The learning environments are safer with fresh air coming into all the classroom learning areas. I believe you will be pleased with the new learning environments and the cost savings to the school districts. Come and see!

David, Eric, Gwen and Susan have been busy cleaning classrooms, carpets, dusting from construction and waxing floors in preparation for the opening of school. The high school is finished in the learning areas. They have painted the west walls of the elementary classrooms and dusting shelves in preparation for waxing and carpet cleaning at the elementary. Building renovations have them a bit behind but they are busy cleaning and getting ready for school. When you have an opportunity, thank them for all their hard work at school. Rick has been going through the district vehicles making sure they are ready for the upcoming school year.

I would encourage you to meet new teachers to our school team for the upcoming year. Mr. Javier Martinez is our new Spanish teacher from Spain. Mrs. Amanda Jensen is our new high school mathematics instructor. Ms. Anna Meyer will be serving as our new 3rd grade instructor and Mrs. Terri Osborn will be teaching sixth grade this year. Many of you may have known her two years ago when she student taught at Maywood. Mr. Brad Thoendel is serving as our new industrial arts instructor for the 2021-2022 academic year. Stop by and greet them, they are excited to meet and get to know you and join our Maywood school family.

I am looking forward to school opening and sharing all the experiences we will have as Maywood Wolves! Enjoy your last few weeks before school begins on August 13, 2021.

Maywood Public School is participating in the USDA's waiver which allows schools to operate the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) for School Year 2021-2022.

What does this mean for you:

Your student will receive meals at no cost for the entire 2021-2022 school year.



Please complete the EZ meal app that can be found on the MPS website.

Although your student will be receiving meals at no cost, completion of the application is important for the following reasons:

- **P-EBT Benefits:** Households may be eligible for Pandemic-EBT benefits through the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services. P-EBT benefits are based in part on eligibility for Free & Reduced-Price meals.
- Fee Waivers and Health Insurance: Student Fee and Reduced-Price meal eligibility can be shared with other programs (with parental consent) for the purposes of fee waivers, scholar-ships, Medicaid and SCHIP.
- School Benefits: Your school receives State and local funding based on the number of students eligible for Free and Reduced-Price meals.

IMPORTANT: Your student(s) will continue to receive meals at no cost for the 2021-22 school year regardless of the eligibility determination of your household's SY2021-2022 application.

First Day of School

The first day of school is Friday, August 13, 2021 with a 1:00 p.m. dismissal. Breakfast and lunch will be served. Classes begin at 8:00 a.m. on regular school days and will be dismissed at 3:45 p.m. School will be dismissed on Fridays at 2:30 p.m.

New Students

If you have a child who will be attending Maywood Public Schools for the first time, or returning to Maywood after attending another school, please call the office to make an appointment to register between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. The school's number is 308-362-4223.

School Closings

In the event that school is cancelled, dismissed early, or we are having a late school start, the information will be broadcast on several area stations. Also, we will be notifying parents through the automated calling system. Please check your handbook for that information.

Bus Routes

Bus Routes will have some minor changes again this year as families move in and out of the district. Your bus driver will contact you with pick up times prior to the first day of school.

Breakfast and Lunch Program

Extra milk for lunch will be \$.50. Second helpings of the main dish and dessert are \$1.00 each. Your child's lunch account will be charged for any seconds taken. Fruits and vegetables are free. If you do not want your child to receive seconds, please call the school at 308-362-4223. Students in Kindergarten and 1st grade will have the option of a milk at snack break. This milk will be \$.50 and charged to your child's account also.

The Mission of TeamMates *is to positively impact the world by inspiring youth to reach their full potential through mentoring*. Established in 1991 by Tom and Nancy Osborne, TeamMates was formed in an effort to provide support and encouragement to all school-aged youth. The goal is to see young people graduate from high school and pursue a post-secondary education. TeamMates has touched the lives of thousands of youth and mentors across the Midwest. Right now, more than 10,200 matches are meeting in schools across Nebraska, lowa, Kansas, Wyoming, and South Dakota.

The impact of the TeamMates match on the mentee and mentor is profound.

- 54% of mentees showed improved academic achievement after being matched with their mentor.
- 85% of mentors report they feel more hopeful after meeting with their mentee.
- 98% of mentees say they trust their mentor.
- More than 95% of mentees report that they are happy when they meet with their mentor, that their mentor talks to them about what they do well, they feel important when they are with their mentor and that they trust their mentor.

Data collection from Gallup's Clifton Strengths Project has helped affirm what TeamMates had already believed to be true:

- Strengths-based mentoring positively influences student engagement with school.
- Students in the control group who received no strengths training as part of their mentoring program were significantly less likely to strongly agree that they looked forward to seeing their mentor over time.
- There is a positive correlation between a student looking forward to seeing their mentor and overall levels of hope, engagement and well-being.

TeamMates has been recognized as a "Best Practice" mentoring organization which means the structure, policy and procedures are in place for a safe and consistent program. TeamMates adheres to *the Elements of Effective Practice* which were developed by the National Mentoring Partnership as the national standards for running a quality mentoring program.

To support a mentor/mentee match, it costs the TeamMates Mentoring Program approximately \$400 compared to the national average cost per match for mentoring programs of \$1,000 to \$2,000 per match. TeamMates is an effective and efficient mentoring organization due in part to its school-based match meeting venue, allowing for low-cost and in-kind support from participating school districts which keeps costs low.

The National Mentoring Partnership reports 1 in 3 children will go through life without a mentor. TeamMates believes all children, no matter their life experience, can benefit from a relationship with a safe, caring adult. You don't have to be an expert. You just have to be there. That's why TeamMates' vision is reach the gold standard of school-based mentoring programs and serve 12,000 youth by 2020.


