No, It's NOT COVID-19 — It's Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease 2025!

Now and then, something unexpected makes its way through the community. Recently, Maywood High School has seen a small but steady number of students diagnosed with Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease (HFMD). While HFMD is typically seen in younger children, it can affect people of all ages. It's a common viral infection that causes painful blisters in the mouth, on the hands, feet, and sometimes the buttocks. Individuals can contract the virus more than once.

Symptoms of HFMD:

- Painful blisters in the mouth (on the tongue, gums, and inner cheeks)
- Blisters or rashes on the hands, feet, mouth, throat, and buttocks
- Sore throat and fever
- · Decreased appetite and irritability
- Adults may experience mild, flu-like symptoms with a similar rash, sometimes lasting longer than in children

Although there is no specific medical cure, symptoms can be managed, and most people recover within 7–10 days. The illness often begins with a fever followed by a rash that turns into small blisters, typically appearing on the palms of the hands and soles of the feet. HFMD is most contagious during the first week or while a fever is present. The virus spreads through saliva, mucus, coughing, and feces, and it can continue to spread for several weeks after symptoms have resolved.

The Southwest Nebraska Public Health Department recommends that students return to school after being fever-free for three full days. "I typically tell people to wait until their fever has been gone for at least 24 hours before returning to normal activities," says Dr. Vaughan.

How Families Can Help Prevent the Spread:

- Disinfect frequently touched surfaces (tables, chairs, doorknobs, etc.) daily using a disinfectant or mild bleach solution.
- Practice good hand hygiene. Dr. Yen, a pediatrician at Texas Children's, emphasizes that proper handwashing means using soap and water—not just rinsing—and washing thoroughly.
- Avoid contact with bodily fluids such as saliva, mucus, and fluid from blisters.

Our Maywood Schools custodial team is taking extra care to disinfect classrooms, restrooms, and common areas to help reduce exposure. HFMD tends to circulate during summer and fall, and as we move into winter, we expect cases to decline. In the meantime, continued good hygiene and awareness are the best ways to keep our students and community healthy.

Virtual School Health

Virtual School Health is a way for your child to see a Children's Nebraska provider during school hours while in the school health office. The school nurse or school staff will let the parent/caregiver know if your child is sick and should be seen by the Children's provider. The provider, along with the school nurse or school staff, will check your child through an internet connection using a special camera to look at eyes, ears, throat, and skin. A special microphone and stethoscope is used to hear lung and heart sounds. This is a real-time visit with a medical provider who can see your child by video.

What kind of conditions and illnesses can be seen by the Virtual School Health provider?

- Ear infections
- Sore throats
- Pink eye
- Skin Rashes
- Sinus infections
- Upper respiratory infections
- Allergic rhinitis
- Asthma flare-ups

- Influenza
- Impetigo
- Lice
- Scabies




