Understanding & Making Sense of Our World

The past two weeks have been confusing to our students. The assassination of Charlie Kirk, has created a profound impact on our students. To be honest, I was not aware of Mr. Kirk and his efforts to bring civility and a positive push for the First Amendment, Free Speech. I remember Mr. Komenda, my social studies instructor teaching us that "Liberty" (Freedom) is achieved when we respect the rights of the minority, while following the rule of the majority, with civility and peace. Webster's Dictionary defines Liberty, "While liberty grants autonomy, it does not mean absolute freedom; rather, it comes with the responsibility to respect the rights and freedoms of others, as one person's liberty should not infringe on another's."

Sadly, our children are struggling to have a positive vision of our society and country.

People in our country are very divided on political viewpoints and how our society should be. Gov. Spencer Cox stated to CBS 60 Minutes, "I do believe that social media is a cancer. And it is taking all of our worst impulses and putting them on steroids. It is driving us to division. It is driving us to hate. These algorithms that have captured our, our very souls." Unfortunately, parents, educators, and community members are inundated growing fear and negativity. We are losing respect for human life and becoming politically violent. Governors Michelle Lujan Grisham, of New Mexico (Democrat) and Governor Spencer Cox (Republican) are working together both receiving considerable political criticism for desiring unity. Governor Cox ran a positive campaign for his second term and won the election.

How do we help our children? First, we need to help children see the positives of our American society and lives. I strongly encourage parents to limit the social media time our students are receiving by placing limits on their social media activities. I like Dr. Martin Luther King's statement, "We must accept finite disappointment, but never lose infinite hope."



Start Smart with Routines!

Routines make it easier for children to remember tasks and carry them out. For a smoother school year, set up these routines:

- An evening prep session: Agree on outfits, make and refrigerate lunches, pack backpacks and set them by the door. Mornings will be much less hectic!
- **A soothing bedtime:** Choose a time that allows for 9 to 12 hours of sleep. Help your child relax with a bath or shower and a cozy read aloud.
- A reading and schoolwork time: This should be when your elementary schooler will have the most energy and motivation.
- **Foster Student Responsibility:** Teach your child how to keep track of school activities, due dates, test dates, snack duty, or special events by writing dates on a family calendar.

Once set up and in place, routines can help to reduce the stress and anxiety that comes with unpredictability. Routines can help create a calmer household by establishing expectations. Routines can help children build life skills and build healthy habits. Routines can help parents feel more organized and find time for enjoyable activities!



Virtual School Health

Virtual School Health is a way for your child to see a Children's Nebraska provider during school hours while in the school health office. The school nurse or school staff will let the parent/caregiver know if your child is sick and should be seen by the Children's provider. The provider, along with the school nurse or school staff, will check your child through an internet connection using a special camera to look at eyes, ears, throat, and skin. A special microphone and stethoscope is used to hear lung and heart sounds. This is a real-time visit with a medical provider who can see your child by video.

What kind of conditions and illnesses can be seen by the Virtual School Health provider?

- Thanks to generous sponsors, bonus funds, and "power-hour" drawings will provide additional dollars to organizations throughout the day.


