Extra Help!

When my daughters went through high school they would come to me for homework assistance, which was okay when they were younger, however in upper course work in high school, frankly, I was not much help. I did take the time to help them learn to research topics and information in their textbooks and library resources. I felt limited providing help for their questions, which you may feel as well. Today's curriculum is much more focused on students utilizing multiple options to problem solve, which some options I did not cover in high school or in my preservice training in college.

I want to make you aware of a FREE online Tutoring service for K-12 students called **Nebraska SMART**. The SMART acronym stands for "Success Made Accessible through Rural Tutoring. Nebraska SMART serves students from all school districts affiliated with the Nebraska Rural Community School Association (NRCSA), as well as districts supported by ESU 1, 4, and 13.

Students will need to register for tutoring by visiting <https://www.nscs.edu/nebraskasmart>. Students make appointments with a Nebraska SMART tutor by logging into their personal account through the Nebraska SMART website. Students may also request "on-demand" tutoring by logging in during tutoring hours, which are from 3:30-7:30 Monday through Thursday. Students will need to upload assignments in advance for which they need to receive help or a picture of the work will also suffice.

Tutors are available from our state colleges of Wayne State, Chadron State and Peru State College. This is a unique opportunity for K-12 students. "This initiative offers vital academic support to students in rural communities while simultaneously enriching the educational experience for our teacher education candidates," said Dr. Paul Turman, Chancellor of the Nebraska State College System. "By participating in deepening their commitment to serving Nebraska's schools. This creates a lasting impact on the future of education in our state."

Nebraska SMART is an excellent opportunity for students and parents to receive help with school homework. I would encourage you to sign up and take advantage of the opportunity. Currently, only two students are using this free benefit within the ESU #15 area. Since knowledge is power, this is a way to gain the knowledge to be an empowered learner!

Start Smart with Routines!

Routines make it easier for children to remember tasks and carry them out. For a smoother school year, set up these routines:

- **An evening prep session:** Agree on outfits, make and refrigerate lunches, pack backpacks and set them by the door. Mornings will be much less hectic!
- **A soothing bedtime:** Choose a time that allows for 9 to 12 hours of sleep. Help your child relax with a bath or shower and a cozy read aloud.
- **A reading and schoolwork time:** This should be when your elementary schooler will have the most energy and motivation.
- **Foster Student Responsibility:** Teach your child how to keep track of school activities, due dates, test dates, snack duty, or special events by writing dates on a family calendar.

Once set up and in place, routines can help to reduce the stress and anxiety that comes with unpredictability. Routines can help create a calmer household by establishing expectations. 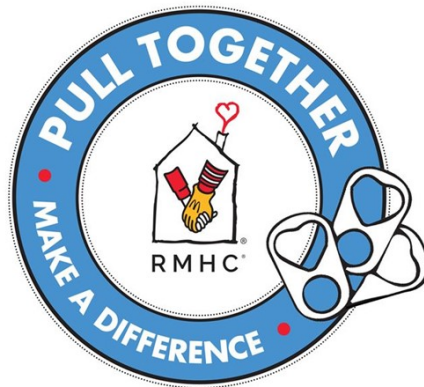
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The Trip of a Lifetime
